PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Students will have the opportunity to travel to Copenhagen, Denmark's capital, for the first part of the trip. The group will take three days exploring Copenhagen; experiencing, sketching and photographing some of the magnificent architectural expressions of prestige such as Copenhagen's most important tourist attractions, such as The Børsen (The Exchange), The Rundetårn (Round Tower), Rosenborg Castle and more recently Frederiksstad. The group will then move to Horsens by train to undertake a series of workshops at VIA. VIA will also provide a guided tour to Aarhus – the second largest city in Denmark known as the cultural and economic core of the region. The group will then return to Copenhagen by train to continue to explore some of the 11 architectural masterpieces before returning home such as:

The National Aquarium
The Royal Danish Playhouse
M/S Maritime Museum
